

Physical:


- To develop technology as a tool for learning.





Regular Meetings of the Averroes Education Board are held once a month. Special meetings are called when necessary at a time and place announced in advance.



CURRICULUM

ELEMENTARY SECTION

The Averroes Elementary Section Curriculum is based on established Pre-School methods and standards, further enriched by Averroes professionals to meet the following objectives:

- Inculcate strong Islamic values in the students.
- Help the students in their intellectual, emotional, physical and social development.
- Enable the students to become independent learners.
- Help each student to recognize and understand his/her role in the world.
- Prepare the students to become Da'ees (preachers) of Islam.

At the Averroes Elementary Section, the balanced approach in curriculum designing, focuses not only on the students' physical and mental grooming, but also on their spiritual uplifting. The activity-based methodology emphasizes creativity along with Tarbiyah as the main feature of Averroes Elementary Section. The students begin their day with the remembrance of Allah during specially prepared assemblies.

Arabic Language

Arabic language starts right from Play Group, so that the children are able to practice it by the time they reach the higher grades. This is considered a key to unite the Muslims all over the world and to understand the Book of Allah in the language it was revealed in. The Elementary students use specially designed Arabic workbooks, developed in-house, which help the children build Arabic vocabulary quickly and practice Arabic letters.

English Language

The students are encouraged to communicate in English language. The spoken abilities are enhanced through daily practice of phonics, whereas the reading skills are developed through an intense levelled Reading Program. We follow a Synthetic Phonic Program using interactive boards and tablets in the classrooms to enhance the listening and reading capability of students. The written expression is polished through a well-structured curriculum focused on appreciating creativity along with improving the hand writing.

Bangla Language

Bangla language is highly valued at the school and is taught with the same zeal and emphasis as English and Arabic.

Mathematics

Special Averroes Elementary Section material is used to make Mathematics a fun and an exciting subject. It helps to build concrete base of numeracy which would help these students in future to learn and apply complex mathematical concepts to real-world problems.

Islamic Studies

At Averroes, Islamic Studies is a subject thoroughly enjoyed by our students The lessons are planned in line with the Averroes Elementary Section methodology and are based on imparting not just knowledge but practical application of all concepts making it relevant to the child's age and understanding. The focus is also on inculcating the love of Allah, Prophet Mohammad and the Holy Qur'an into the very hearts of our students. We use our own workbooks developed specially for Averroes Elementary Section by our Board of Scholars.

Cultural Studies

Cultural Studies involve selected topics from Geography, History, Botany, Zoology, Science and Social Studies. Exploring 2D and 3D Art stimulates creativity and broadens the mind. Painting, cutting and sticking, drawing, making patterns with symmetry and recycling are all fun ways to learn art and craft.

Sensorial Exercises

While Exercises for Practical Life help make our students more independent and confident, the Sensorial exercises sharpen and enhance the mental development of students. These activities help train the children to take care of themselves and their environment. Regular Sports activities help keep our students physically fit and mentally healthy.

2D and 3D Art

Exploring 2D and 3D Art stimulates creativity and broadens the mind. Painting, cutting and sticking, drawing, making patterns with symmetry and recycling are all fun ways to learn art and craft.

Assessment

The students' progress is closely monitored by assistant teachers, class teachers, subject teachers, level coordinators and the Section Head. Daily behaviour reports help in the identification of areas of concern, whether it is academic or otherwise and aid in planning to overcome them. Remedial programs are carried out for those students who require special attention in certain academic areas. If required, problems are discussed with parents so that they can also play a positive role in helping their child cope. Report cards prepared on the basis of regular ongoing assessment are sent to the parents at the end of each term.

Training

We at Averroes pay special attention to the training and development of our staff. Every year we plan and conduct an Annual Training session for our teachers to share with them the new discoveries and latest practices in the field of education. We keep the parents involved through multiple workshops conducted to guide and enable them to teach and train their children hence resonating the positive impact of the School.



A DAY AT AVERROES ELEMENTARY SECTION

Smile & Salam

'Walk the talk' is what the Averros staff believes, greeting every student, each morning with a smile and greeting of peace - 'Assalamu alaikum WRT'. This embeds the sunnah of saying salam and soon becomes a common practice within our students.

Morning Assembly

Providing an energetic start to the day, students gather for the morning assembly where every child is given the opportunity to participate in order to gain confidence from an early age.

Circle Time

A recount of previous learning, moral themes and class rules all take place during circle-time. Subsequently, children take a peek into what is planned for the day ahead.

Arabic Class

Arabic is taught in such a manner that our students can grasp it easily ultimately developing the ability to converse in Arabic fluently.

Sports

An all-time favourite of our students is the sports class. With the guidance of a trained teacher, students learn and excel in various games and exercises, as well as build on teamwork, patience and the passion to succeed.

Tiffin / Lunch Time

Washing hands, setting the table and saying 'Bismillah' before enjoying favourite snacks is all part of the tiffin/lunch time. The teachers join their students to teach eating etiquettes; such as using the right hand, sharing and finishing the meal.

Material Time

The 'Material time' gives students the opportunity to unleash their potential by working with the Averroes Elementary Section material is especially designed to teach children various skills including better hand eye coordination, self-discipline, self-correction and focus while enhancing cognitive skills and creativity. These activities lay the foundation for future learning. It is a wonderful time for students to engage in numerous tasks with the freedom to choose from the available material. In Averroes, we ensure the availability of sufficient age-appropriate Montessori material to keep all the students involved simultaneously.

After School Facility

Due to varied dismissal times of siblings, staff or even parents who are unable to make it to school on-time to pick up their children due to work hours, an after-school facility is available. However, this time is made purposeful for the students by engaging them in interesting activities, snacking or even taking a short nap and feeling refreshed before going home.

Departure Time

The security of our students is extremely important for us and so departure time is exceptionally organised. A pick-up card system is in place, which authorises the card holder only to pick up the student.

PRIMARY SECTION

Primary Section is Alhamdulillah well on its way to attain the vision of the School where students are being trained in a positive environment by passionate and dedicated teachers. Our approach to learning is evolving every day; modern and innovative techniques are being adopted to educate the students. These techniques optimize self-belief, competence and proficiency.

The Primary Section comprises of grades I - III.

Key Features

- Activity-based learning with modern teaching techniques.
- 2. Teaching languages, sciences and concepts with Islamic integration.
- 3. Tarbiyah, in and outside the classroom to make better Muslims.
- 4. Providing classroom environment which is embedded with Islamic principles and teachings.
- 5. Teaching Arabic and Tajweed as regular subjects to make understanding of the Holy Qur'an easier.
- 6. Following monthly moral themes to incorporate essential Islamic values.
- Offering Zuhr Salah in congregation on campus.
- Exclusive opportunities to meet and learn from religious scholars and professionals. Participation and distinctions in national and international.

Students are guided to become self-motivated learners, who are strong academically and are able to foster their own ability to think comprehensively and clearly. Subject details are as follows:



Quran Recitation & Memorization

From the beginning, students learn the art of recitation of the Holy Qur'an. They also memorize different Surahs, learn hadith and Duas.

Arabic Language

Arabic is taught in a simplified and effective manner building upon reading, writing and conversing skills. Being the language of the Qur'an, it holds great importance within the academic framework of Averroes.

English

Being an English medium school, students are taught to communicate fluently and effectively in English. During the year all areas of the subject are covered; including reading, writing, listening and speaking effectively in English.

Bangla

As the national language, Bangla is highly valued at the School and is taught with the same zeal and emphasis as English and Arabic.

Mathematics

Students are taught mathematical concepts which are reinforced through practical activities. The methodology adopted at Averroes provides a platform for students to become independent in utilizing their mathematical skills. This approach helps form a strong foundation to build upon in coming academic years.

Islamic Studies

The School has a thematic approach to the way Islamic Studies is taught, where a concept is reinforced in all aspects of teaching. Through this process students learn in an engaging manner, which helps increase their knowledge while enriching their faith and thus translating into action.

Science

Science is taught in such a way that students are made to realize and appreciate the grandeur of Allah and His creation. They are motivated to understand the application of scientific concepts through experiments, diagrams, flow charts, documentaries and science projects. Exhibitions and competitions held by the School are an effective means to further nurture students' scientific inquisitiveness. Students are encouraged to make discoveries, devise formulae and experiment on their own.

ICT

A rigorous and engaging ICT curriculum with Islamic integration is in place at Averroes. The focus of the subject is to teach basic computer skills including computational & problem-solving skills, programming, web browsing, cutting-edge technologies like robots & biometrics.



General Knowledge

Students develop an understanding of the world through Geography in which they learn about the environment, other cultures, their economy and politics. Emphasis is placed upon how to become responsible and active citizens of the world. Through History, students derive important lessons from the past and benefit from a focused study of Muslim Heroes.

Expressive Arts

Expressive Arts is a combined subject involving dramatic skills for stage performances, delivering speeches amongst small groups or before the morning assembly and building on existing skills and talents, thereby developing stage presence and self-confidence. Arts and Crafts is a way to expand a student's mind, broadening his/her horizons in being creative and helping them refine their gross and fine motor skills. Students use this time to analyze, criticize and produce original pieces of Art.

Physical Education

Health and Fitness is ensured by providing the students training in sports such as Basket Ball, Martial Arts, Badminton, Table Tennis etc. All students partake in weekly physical activities.

Assessment & Grading

The academic progress of the students is systematically monitored by teachers and the Section Head through close observation as well as through the assessment of class work, quizzes, tests, oral assessments, projects and examination. The grading and assessment system is one that is made comprehensible for the students and parents to reflect upon the child's progress and set future targets.

SECONDARY SECTION

Secondary Section at A International School is offered with a number of distinctive features. Alongside academic excellence and life skills, we also focus on the spiritual development of the students. Averroes offers Edexcel based qualification to its students and strives to inspire the right attitude and skills. The Secondary Section currently comprises of grades IV – X.

Key Features

By providing an ideal Islamic environment and through the integration of Islamic teachings with the curriculum, we help our students develop a strong bond with Allah. All our efforts are focused towards making our students responsible Muslims who can play leading role in the progress of the world motivated by Islamic teachings and guidance. Through the lessons on Seerah of Prophet and the history of Sahabah, they get a chance to admire the golden era of Muslims and internalize the efforts needed to bring such changes in our society, even today.

We ensure that our students are given activity based learning which enhances their level of creativity, confidence and understanding.

Quran Recitation

This subject aims to enable the students to recite the Holy Qur'an accurately. Qur'anic recitation is an integral and important element of all school assemblies, in-house and external events. The Annual Competition Qiraat motivates our students to strive in beautifying their recitation of the Qur'anic verses with skillful fluency. From grade VI onwards, this subject is integrated with Qur'an Translation and Tafseer where students learn the skill of perfect recitation of the verses taught in on a weekly Tafseer basis.

Arabic Language

Students are taught Arabic from the basic level and further taken to an advanced level of speaking, reading and writing. Students practice their language skills through role plays, library sessions, assembly presentations and classroom discussions. This subject facilitates the students in understanding the Qur'an deeply in its original language.

English

While teaching English as a language we focus on reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. Students are given experience of developing content for brochures, documentaries, poetry composition etc.

Reading skills are not limited to comprehension alone, through developing these skills, we aim to instil the love of reading and gaining knowledge through books. Our library contains a wide variety of carefully selected age appropriate books.

Students are taught the award-winning biography of Prophet Muhammad, as a part of the literature syllabus. Through this, the students not only get to study the sophisticated non-fiction genre, but also get to explore and critically analyse the Pre-Islamic world In comparison to the lineage, life, personality, character traits and sequence of events in the life of Prophet Muhammad, and refer to him as an exemplary role model for humanity.

Bangla

Bangla is taught with an extraordinary zeal and zest through creative activities. Our students participate in speeches & debates, conduct interviews, write reports and compose personifications in Bangla. Students also conduct assembly presentations as well as execute theme of the month through different activities.

Mathematics

Mathematics is taught with reference to daily problem solving. Our specialist teachers have an insight into the future requirements for higher grades and strive to make our students competent enough to be able to meet higher standards and reach broader horizons. Mathematics is Islamically integrated for its strands with the skills of algebra, geometry, data interpretation in all parts of our syllabus books.

Islamic Studies

A separate department is dedicated to the development of the Islamic Studies Curriculum. Our school has a thematic approach to the way Islamic Studies is taught, where a concept is reinforced in all aspects of teaching. Through this process, students learn in an engaging manner, simultaneously helping to increase their knowledge, while enriching their faith and thus translating into immediate action.



Science

Science is one of the most significant subjects of our curriculum. Our students enjoy conducting experiments in the science lab and are trained by the subject experts to form hypothesis and reach conclusions.

Further, students are given opportunities to display and present a vast range of science projects to open audiences. All their research work is Islamically integrated, thus training our students to not just learn science with a deeper purpose, but to transfer their research as a Daee' to the rest of the world, benefitting from such opportunities to strike upon intellectual thinking and discovering ways to spread the world of Allah.

At IGCSE / IGCSE level, students study Physics, Biology and Chemistry as separate subjects with emphasis on inquiry-based learning to prepare them for external examination.

ICT

ICT is catered through the syllabus book for each grade. Our well-equipped computer lab contains all the necessities required for the students to get hands-on experience. Students are trained to use various programs, design, graphics, code programs and websites, and surf the internet according to a specifically designed age-appropriate designed syllabus.

General Knowledge

The main purpose of this subject is to enhance the general knowledge of the students about Islam and the world. To serve this purpose, two subjects are taught under General Knowledge i.e., History and Geography.

Expressive Arts

Expressive Arts is serving as a part of creative expression which is so far in practice for Grade V. However, our faculty keeps all internal and external art competitions open for the rest of the students too in order to give equal opportunity to the artistically inclined and skillfully creative minds. The subject is assessed through the exhibition of different art-related projects made by the students under the supervision of their art teachers.

Physical Education

Health and Fitness is ensured by providing the students training in sports such as Basket Ball, Martial Art. Badminton, Table Tennis, Football, Gymnastics etc. All students partake in weekly physical activities.

Qur'an Translation and Tafseer

This specialized subject is taught from Grade VI onwards in which the students learn to derive root words, grasp the translation and acquire a deep understanding of the verses of the Holy Qur'an.

In this comprehensive subject, spread over 7 years, students learn complete word-to-word translation and Tafseer of the Holy Qur'an. The purpose is to instil a thorough and profound understanding of Qur'an in the future Daee's of Islam so that the Qur'an is absorbed in their hearts and reflected in their actions.

Our subject specialist teachers ensure introspective thought process and encourage the students to become evaluative individuals having more insight into what Allah expects from mankind and the standards He has set for His believing slaves.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

Averroes International School has initiated an after-school program entitled 'Homework Solving Session' & Intense Hifz Program. After-school programs are ideal for engaging youth in positive activities in a safe and supervised environment while parents are at work and also for those who are interested in providing wider opportunities for growth to their children. The After School program provides opportunities for children to explore interests, gain competency in real-life skills, solve problems, and assume leadership roles. Community Quran Course

ABOUT HIFZUL QURAAN

Criteria for Enrolment

- Age Limit: Students want to apply for Hifz must be 5 years old or above. After Completion of grade four (12 years old) no Hifz Program will be offered apart from regular Al Quran classes & Quran revision classes.
- They need to collect and submit a Hifz application form and an interview will be taken of the Candidate and the parents by the Department Head of Al Quran and Head of School to find out the level of the candidate and learning environment at home.
- Students will have to fulfil the Hifz Course entrance criteria, which consists of an oral exam.
 Prospective pupils are expected to be able to recite the Qur'an fluently as well as demon strate a fundamental knowledge of Tajweed, such as Makharij, Mudud, Wuqoof, Qalqala & Gunnah rules. The students who will not be able to meet the criteria will go for Pre Hifz.
- Both the student and parents will have to make a firm commitment for the entire period of course in order to meet their targets consistently and ensure the learning environment at home. This will, InshaAllah, enable the achievement of completing Hifz of the Noble Qur'an with ease and efficiency.
- Finally, it is of extreme importance that both parents and the pupil have a clear understanding of the level of commitment – and significant sacrifices – that will be required in order to achieve this honour and privilege.
- Once get accepted for Hifz, He/She must be committed to spend 6 hours at least in memorising the Quran per day including the Hifz timing at school
- In order for a pupil to successfully complete the memorisation of the entire Qur'an, he/she
 will be expected to memorise the amounts stated in the chart below on daily basis
 throughout the Hifz period. These targets may be revised in consultation with the Head of
 Hifz Studies and the Hifz teacher for pupils who may not be able to complete the entire Qur'an.

A BRIEF ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Once the admission opening date has been decided, Parents can call, email for the admission information or may come to the School Campus & complete the prescribed query form regarding admission.

- Step 1: Issuance of Hand book
- Step 2: Parent to meet admission office to get details of admission procedure, fee schedule etc. After approval of MD & CEO/Head of School/Vice Principal, parents can obtain the prescribed admission form from the Admission's Office at a particular cost.
- Step 3: Oral Interaction (with parents and student): Play Group to Pre KG
- Step 4: Written test for KG to Class X.
- Step 5: Admission orders An SMS of admission given to the parents
- Step 6: Fees to be deposited in the Accounts Department or in mentioned Bank
- Step 7: Parent has to fill up the required details to complete the admission form and submit the form. Recent passport size photograph of student & parent, a copy of child's birth certificate, Proof of Identification for both parents (Passport or National ID) recent report cards photocopy must be submitted along with admission form to the Admission Office.
- Step 8: Admission Office will accept admission applications within a deadline (or on a seat-available basis).
- Step 9: Uniform, books & stationery must be collected by the parents from school.
- Step 10: Join Averroes orientation & be a proud member of Averroes Family

Admission into Play Group

There is no written test for the students who will be applying for admission into play group. There will be a short interview with the student along with his/her parents. The interview will be conducted either by Vice Principal or Child Psychologist.

Admission into Nursery

No written test is required to get admitted into Nursery but student must need to be able to identify or write basic alphabets and numbers. A short Interview will be conducted by Vice Principal or Child Psychologist to understand the mental growth of the student.

Admission into KG to Class X

Admission test is necessary for everyone, even if copies of appropriate report cards, showing satisfactory achievement, are submitted.

Admission into A-Level

For entry into class XI a copy of the results in the IGCSE O'Level examination or a copy of the admit card for appearing at IGCSE O' Level examination (whichever is appropriate) in at least six subjects including English Language, Bangla and Mathematics – B will be required.

Admission into Play Group

A child who will be of 3 years' age in the month of May/June of the current year will be eligible.

Admission into Nursery

A child who will be of 4 years' age in the month of May/June of the current year and who has completed one year of Play Group in an institution equivalent to Averroes will be eligible.

Admission into Pre KG

A child who will be of 5 years' age in the month of May/June of the current year will be eligible.

SCHOLARSHIP POLICY

Who May Apply?

The scholarship is open to students of all school of Bangladesh and includes current students of Averroes. Students applying for the scholarship must be between 11 - 14 years old on or before 1st of Sept of the academic year. Others required academic qualifications are as follows:

- Any student obtaining grades of 95% or equivalent in 6 key subjects is awarded a cheque of tk 1000/per month for a year. This is only applicable for students of Grade VI to X.
- Averroes also has a scholarship grant policy for the MERITORIOUS and UNDERPRIVILEGED students of Bangladesh. School selects these students from various parts of Bangladesh through placement Assessments and interviews. School provides these students with full free accommodation, food and also bears all types of educational expenses.

How to Apply?

Once the advertisement for scholarship is displayed on the website and on Averroes official Facebook ID, application forms may be collected from our Admissions Office. Candidates must attach a copy of the last two years of academic reports and documentation regarding any awards they may have received. Interested candidates then will be contacted by the AIS Admissions office with further information regarding scholarship information evening, examinations and interview dates.

HOMEWORK POLICY

Homework is an integral part of the school program. It reinforces and supports their learning. It is assigned daily, Sunday through Thursday and occasionally on weekends. Time expectations are set according to the grade level and ability of an average performing student. Homework assignments are given to encourage students' academic independence while offering parents an opportunity to view their child's work, Grades 1–10 homework is part of overall grade.

The above chart indicates an average time required for students each night. Some students will be able to finish it sooner, others may take longer. Students should keep record of long and short-term assignments in their homework notebooks, or student planners.

Parents are responsible for providing an appropriate place for the child to do his/her homework. The place of study should be well ventilated with good lighting, clean, organized and quiet. Parents should supervise their child in seeing that assignments are completed neatly and accurately. It is also important to schedule homework and develop proper study habits, so that family activities do not conflict with it.

SCHOOL RULES & REGULATIONS

Session

The academic year of the school is from July to June – Students are admitted into Classes from Play Group to Class VIII. Admission into Classes IX and X is normally restricted as O'Level programme starts from Class VIII.

Assembly

School assembly is held regularly except during Ramadan and during Half-Yearly and Annual Examinations. A short verse from the Holy Quran, School Oath and National Anthem are delivered as well as other information pertaining to school life and character building. All students must be present at assembly.

ECA & Club Activities Schedules

The students from grade 3 to 9 take physical exercises and play games once a week during their class time. Students are instructed to wear sports uniform once a week for participating games period in field. We have decorated a floor with different types of sports equipment for the students of Junior Section.

Persons seeking admission to the Averroes must satisfactorily meet all residencies, academic, age, immunization, discipline, and other pre-requisites as established by the Education Board policies.

Transferring Students

All transferring students must request their previously attended school(s) to transfer their records, including discipline records, to Averroes reserves the right to re-test the child and accordingly may ask him/her to repeat the same grade. If the child was dismissed from previous school for bad behavior he/she may not be accepted in our school. Parents / guardians are required to attend an orientation at the beginning of each school year to establish understanding and cooperation between the school and home.

Parents Responsibilities

Parents' consistent support for the school, its staff and educational programs will create a positive attitude in our students about education and the role of school. The Averroes families are all aware of the blessings received by donating of themselves on behalf of their community. As parents, we also have an important duty toward our children. An Islamic education, a high academic standard and a healthy environment for both body and soul are basic requirements for every Muslim family. Averroes continuously work hard to provide these elements to our children without adding extra burdens on the families.

Parents as Partners

Cooperation between the family and the school is essential. The school requires parents' full support for its educational program to be effective and successful. If you have any questions or concerns, the procedure is to first contact your child's teacher. If the matter remains unresolved, you may contact the Head of School to better assist you. If you are still not satisfied, send your concerns in writing to the Board.

Parent-Teacher Association (PTA)

The PTA serves as a support system for the school. The main function of the PTA is that of fundraising and helping to organize and/or assist extra-curricular activities for students. The PTA is not a policy-making body and does not interfere with the management of the school. All PTA functions and activities will be carried out with the approval of the Head of School (CEO)in coordination with the Averroes Board PTA Liaison and any teacher or staff member involved in that function. A strong PTA is essential to the success of our school. All parents are strongly encouraged to become actively involved in school activities and courteously share their input, so that we continuously work on creating parent-teacher-student alliances.

PTA Structure

Elections are usually held in May for the upcoming school year. During the month of June, the outgoing and incoming PTA will meet to transition duties. The PTA will assume responsibilities beginning one month prior to and one month after the current school year. Meetings are held once a month plus when needed to organize large events.

The PTA governing body will consist of:

- President
- Vice-President
- Secretary
- Treasurer
- Fundraising Coordinator
- Classroom Liaison
- General Members-at-large





ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

We welcome students of all backgrounds to join the Averroes family. Our only requirement is that students and parents follow our school rules and procedures and respect the learning and safety of other students. Depending on the previous report cards, we may require new students to take an entrance examination administered by Averroes to see if they are eligible for admission to the grade level of choice. Play to 1st Grade students must show sufficient readiness to enter their respective grades on their entrance exam. All new students will be on probation for the first academic month. Those showing special learning, speech, behavior or study habit issues may be recommended to repeat a grade, receive extra tutoring, or find a school more suitable to meet the child's needs.

Class placement is according to the child's chronological age and academic needs for that school year.

- All entering Play students must be three years old by July 31st, and show both emotion I and social adeptness for grade level.
- At the time of registration, parents must bring in proof of age by bringing in copies of birth certificates, passports, or other legal documentation.
- It is not our school policy to entertain grade-skipping requests except for unusual circumstances.
 Research on this issue suggests that students who are grade skipped miss out on important social and emotional learning, thus struggle later in life.

Academic Honors and Achievement

Academic excellence is stressed at Averroes. While at the same time believing that students should be intrinsically motivated to perform, Averroes also recognizes student achievements throughout the year such as Stars of the Month, Distinguished Character, Spelling Bee, Quran Competition, Science Fair, and various other activities. The Islamic Character Award is given to one boy and one girl who have shown outstanding Islamic character throughout the entire year. Other subject awards are given by subject teachers according to grade, attitude and overall success in the subject area. Honor Roll is awarded to students who score an average of 90% and above on trimester report cards.

Promotion Policy

Promotion Requirements:

- 1. Attendance at the school at least 80% of the time the student has enrolled for the school year.
- A GPA of 2.0 or above.
- A score of not less than 6 months below grade level in Reading, Mathematics, English and Spelling on standardized achievement tests.

Students receiving more than one D or below will be put on Academic Probation after the first progress report in mid-October. Students will need to keep their grades above a C in order to participate in school fieldtrips and other extracurricular activities. Students will be removed from Academic Probation after three months of acceptable grades. If students continue to have difficulty achieving higher than D in 3 or more core subjects, there will be a conference regarding possible retention with the student, parent and head of school.

Retention Policy

Repeating a grade can be the best option for your child in certain cases. There could be numerous reasons why a student is having trouble keeping up with the grade level materials such as an unidentified learning disability, long-term absence, limited knowledge of English, or immaturity due to age. Repeating a grade is far better than setting up a child for failure as each year he or she falls further behind his/her classmates and loses motivation to learn. Relearning a subject will make a child better grasp the concepts and be able to build upon that knowledge. Repeating a lower grade is easier than repeating a higher grade.

Therefore, please do not push a child beyond what they are ready for. It really depends on each child's unique developmental needs. We want our children to reach their highest potential and be happy with their achievements. Over-reaching and failing at a task can have much more harmful effects on self- esteem and motivation than to be in a class that a child is succeeding and learning.

Therefore, if a student is not meeting the promotion requirements listed above, a teacher-parent-principal meeting will be set up to discuss the option of retention for the next school year.



Late or Make-up Work & Tests

Students who need to make up work due to an absence will have one day to make up for each day they missed. A doctor's note or prior approval from the Principal of school is required for absences of more than three days. It is up to a teacher's discretion to accept any unexcused late work; however, full-credit will not be given for late work. Make up tests will be administered the day the student returns. Each unexcused absence will result in 5% taken off each day the student doesn't make up the test. Parents do not have to call the school if the child has been absent for only one day but should send a note for your child to give to his/her teacher when he/she returns. Students are assigned "study buddies" and should contact them to find out the day's assignment. (Students choose two "study buddies" in each of their classes at the beginning of the year). If the student will be absent for several days, it will be necessary for you to call before 9:00 a.m. on the day before you plan to pick up work assignments, so work will be ready for you at the school office. It is also not a standard policy of the school or teachers to offer extra-credit assignments to students who do not demonstrate effort in completion of assignments and in test-taking. Extra-credit usually gives students an unfair advantage amongst their peers while at the same time producing more work for teachers.

Meet the Scholar/Management/CEO & Head of School

Parent Conferences are held at the end of the first progress report for all students. Parent conferences will also be held prior to spring break and optional at the end of the score year. Conferences are also held throughout the year either at the parents' or teachers' request. Concerns or problems regarding your child should be brought to the attention of the child's teacher promptly. If your child's teacher cannot resolve the situation, a second conference will be held with the Principal. If the matter is still not resolved at the second level, a third conference will be scheduled with the MD & CEO of the Board and the Head of School in order to find a solution to the matter. In order to ensure that the Islamic Scholars can respond to all parental concerns, parents are asked to request the third level conference in writing.

*Please note: It is unprofessional and unethical to discuss problems with anyone about anyone else involving other teachers, staff, parents or community members in a school related conflict or dispute is a ground for dismissal for the child. The school reserves the right to expel or refuse admission to a child whose parents cause disruption in the school or threaten school staff in any way.

ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

Attendance Policy

School hours are from 7:45 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. for Playgroup - O'Levels -Sunday-Thursday. Children should not be brought to school before 7:30 a.m. nor left after 3:30 p.m. during school days. This policy is strictly enforced.

Attendance at school is mandatory. In addition, no student is allowed to leave school premises during school hours without a parent or parent designee (as designated in student emergency cards by parents). Authorized person(s) for student pick-up must be able to present valid identification as a condition for student release.

Absence

A written note from a parent is required upon returning to school, even though the parent may have notified the office by telephone. The student must present the note to the teacher. A doctor's statement is required for absences of more than three days due to illness. If a student has 5 or more unexcused absences in a trimester, a Parents - Management Conference will occur.

Tardy

A tardy is not being in the classroom at 8:01 a.m. Early morning tardiness to class interferes with optimum teaching procedures as well as individual discipline. Tardiness may impact citizenship, Stars of the Month, as well as academic grades.

It is the responsibility of the tardy student to obtain a pass from the school office before entering class. A note from the doctor will verify an excusable tardy. Traffic, over sleeping, or late breakfasts will not be valid reasons for being late in the morning. 10 or more tardies in a session will warrant a Parent-Student-Head of School meeting.

The Head of School and teacher may require satisfactory explanation from a parent or guardian of a student whenever the pupil is absent for all or part of a school day. Students who have repeated unexcused tardiness/absences are subject to academic probation.

Early Release

If a parent wishes to take his/her child out of school before the end of the school day, they need to come in person or send an authorized person to pick up the child. The authorized person must have written or telephone permission by the parent to take the child. In addition, an I.D. may be requested.

The office will have the child called from the classroom. Parents are not allowed to go to the classroom during school hours.

Visitors

All visitors are requested to sign in with the front office and wear a visitor's badge while on campus. The campus is a CLOSED CAMPUS and parents cannot enter classrooms without prior permission or office pass during school hours of 7:50 am to 3:30 pm.

Parents wishing to visit their child's class need to obtain a Visitor's Permit from the school office for a half hour visit. The parent will bring the Permit to class, put it on the teacher's desk and quietly sit in the back of the room. Visitors are not permitted to interrupt, interfere or discuss anything with the teacher or any student during class time. A parent may not bring children or other adults with them with this exception:

- The parent may bring his/her child as a prospective student to visit the class to be assigned.
- Other visitors must secure authorization from the Head of School at least one day in advance.

Textbook Policy

Students are expected to pay close attention to the care of textbooks, workbooks, and other school materials. Students, who vandalize, damage, lose, or return school material in poor condition will be required to buy new immediately.

Library

The library time for each class is scheduled throughout the week. The library is also open during recess and lunch on most days. Students are responsible for returning library materials when due or a fine will be charged.

ICT Acceptable Use Policy

The Averroes International School provides ICT facilities for staff and students to assist them carry out their studies/tasks. Therefore, ICT resources at are intended to be used for lawful educational purposes and to carry out the legitimate business of the school. This policy sets out guidelines for the acceptable use of:

- The School's computer network facilities
- Installed computer software
- The Internet electronic mail which are provided for educational purposes only. Accept able use issues may be broadly categorized as personal conduct relating to:
- System security
- Legal requirements
- Ethical use of the school computer network facilities

User Responsibilities

Users are responsible for all activity carried out on their personal network account. General Network Responsibilities Users will NOT;

- Share their password with anyone else
- Use another person's network account Allow another person to use their account Attempt to change the network in any way
- Install / use any software other than that provided by the school
- Attempt to bypass security
- Store inappropriate material in their network account (e.g. non-program related files, .exe files, personal files, video files, games)

Internet and Email Acceptable Use Responsibilities

All users will use the Internet in a responsible manner for educational purposes - for their classwork and assignment research. Internet use is a privilege, and users must at all times exercise careful judgment over all material that they access and communications that they make.

Email Etiquette (The Golden Rules)

"Communicate to others how you wish to be communicated with"

- Your first option should always be to talk to the person.
- Place the name of a person under "to" when you expect an action or reaction.
- Limit the use of "cc".
- Give every mail a subject title.
- Send only that information which is relevant to the addressee.
- E-mails should be to the point brief, not novels.
- Use reply to sender and be selective with the other names. Avoid using "reply to all",
- English is our school language, also for e-mails.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Student Supervision

Teachers on duty will be supervising students in and outside of the classroom, before-school, recess, lunchtime and after-school. Each Averroes employee is authorized to document and correct inappropriate student behavior even if it is not their direct student. They will be able to decide on the appropriate consequence and provide notification of offense to parents and AIS administration.

Closed Campus

For the protection and safety of students, Avernoes has adopted a closed campus policy. This means students may not leave the school grounds during the day unless their parents come to school office to sign out and pick up their child. Parents will find the sign-out sheet in the school office. Parents are also required to go to school office before going into classrooms directly to obtain permission. Parents who are seen entering classrooms without school office authorization will be stopped and asked to make an appointment with the teacher to minimize classroom disruptions. Any parent or other person whose conduct in a place where a school employee is required to be in the course of his/her duties that disrupts school will be reported. Parents and other visitors must register in the school office at all times during school hours.

Emergency "lock down" procedures

All of us at Averroes value the effort that parents are making to send their children to school. We know that it is a difficult and uncertain time. It is important for all of our community to know that every effort is being taken to keep our school safe. Guards have been issued with metal detectors to check visitors, bags, etc. We apologies for any inconvenience this may cause, but I am sure each one of us wants a safe and secure environment in our school.



In the case of a disturbance outside our school walls, we have a lock down procedure to ensure that every member of our community, especially or children, are kept safe. Our Lockdown Procedure is as follows:

- The school campus will be closed. No one will enter or leave.
- The school will immediately lock the gates. All cctv's at each campus will be actively monitored.
- Teachers will check that all students are accounted for.
- Admin Dept. will organize for an emergency sms to be sent to parents reassuring them
 that their child is safe, and asking them to come and pick up their children when it is
 safe to do so.
- Staff will check each student off as they are collected by their guardian or parent.
- No students will be allowed outside unless they are personally collected by their approved guardian.
- Guardians will be screened prior to collection of students.
- When all students have been collected, staff will be free to leave

Certification Fire Drills, Tornados, Earthquake Awareness

Maximum Teachers& Staff at Averroes are certified in Fire Services Bangladesh and have participated in workshops on Earthquake Awareness and Fire Drills. In the event of an earthquake, students are instructed to:

Drop to the floor beneath their desks, chair, or table with their back to the windows and remain in this position until given further signals and/or instructions for evacuation.

Earthquake

The world experiences thousands of earthquakes every year. Most are either very deep or centered well offshore, causing little damage or injury. However, a severe earthquake can occur at any time with devastating effects.

What is an Earthquake?

The surface of our planet is not a complete shell, but is made up of large pieces, much like a jig-saw puzzle, called tectonic plates. Tectonic plates are always on the move. Tension builds up as they scrape over, under or past each other. In some places movement between the plates is happening all the time, causing frequent small or moderate earthquakes. Other areas, where the movement is not constant, are prone to stronger quakes separated by longer periods of time.

Before -

- Practice your earthquake drill: DROP, COVER AND HOLD.
- Ensure there are no loose objects above you that may fall and cause harm.

During -

DROP, COVER AND HOLD.

- Stay where you are until the shaking stops. If inside remain inside, if outside stay outside.
- While the earth is shaking, do not attempt to run outside or back inside.
- . If inside, get off the stairs. They are the weakest link.
- While inside, it is best to take cover beside (not under) an object, near an outer wall. This should be next
 to a sofa, next to a table, next to a large bulky object that will compress slightly but leave a void next to it.
 When the tremor has stopped, the school will continuously ring a bell. This is the signal to quickly and
 carefully leave the building. Walk to a safe place away from walls or falling objects outside.

After-

- Listen to and follow all instructions from teachers.
- Stay calm.
- Watch out for possible dangers or hazards. Remember there may be some aftershocks.
 When it is all clear, teachers will take you back inside, or parents will be contacted to collect you.

Prohibited Areas

Students are not allowed to enter the following areas:

- Out of school grounds during school hours without prior permission
- Behind modular buildings
- On roof-tops
- Auditorium or administration offices during school hours
- On walls or fences
- In classrooms without adult supervision and prior permission
- In the playground when another class is using it or when eating any food
- Teacher's lounge

Designated Eating & Play Areas

Students can eat in the following areas:

On proper lunch/tiffin areas

Any student who is caught chewing gum will be charged BDT. 100

Students can play in the following areas:

- Grass field
- Playground

Tiffin/Lunch

Students should bring a healthy, nutritious tiffin/lunch to school each day. Scientific research has proven that food with high sugar content is harmful to children and adults. Junk food is, therefore, discouraged and fresh fruits, safe milk and vegetables are recommended. Due to safety issues, no microwaves are available for student use. Do not send anything to be heated or cooked. Extra food is not available. All students will be required to sit in designated areas to eat their tiffin/lunch before playing.

Incase of Illness

We need your cooperation to ensure that the school is a healthy environment. Please assist us by cooperating with the following:

- A child who is ill should not be sent to school.
- Children with running noses, sneezing, coughing, and/or fever must stay at home until symptoms disappear to prevent other children from becoming ill and 24 hours after a fever has subsided.

If a child becomes ill at school, he/she is sent to the office, and the parent is called to take the student home.

 When a parent has been contacted to pick up an ill or injured child, the child must be picked up promptly. The school cannot be held liable for ill or injured children who are not picked up in a timely manner.

Medication

If medicine is to be administered, an adult must bring the medication and the Physician's request for the Administration of Medicine by School Personnel Form, signed by the physician and parent, to the office. No medication should ever be sent to school withchildren at any grade level. Medication such as cough syrup, or any, which required sedation, is never issued without consent from the parent. Prescription medication given for a short period of time (under two weeks) must be accompanied by a signed permission slip from the parent with instructions. Prescription medication given for a period of more than 2 weeks requires a Physician's Request form signed by the doctor as well as the signed permission slip from the parent. The medication must be in its original container, properly labeled by the pharmacist, including name of student and physician, date, dosage, and name of medication, method and time to be administered. In case of injury, the procedure stated on the emergency card will be followed.

Physical Education

A signed parental note is required if a student is ill or injured and cannot participate in physical education. The instructor will modify or exempt the student's activity based upon the parental note. However, the student is still required if possible, to earn a physical education grade according to the instructor's evaluation.

Personal Items

Students may bring to school only such personal items as may legitimately be used at school, which the school does not provide. Parents need to be aware at all times of the items their children bring to school. Toys, comic-books, inappropriate magazines, books or games, guns, knives or any dangerous objects, electronics, make-up, perfume, costume jewelry, and pets are not permitted at school. Food, sweets, and drinks in excess of the student's snack and lunch are not permitted.

If the teacher permits toys to be brought to school for sharing on certain days, the toys must be securely wrapped and have the child's name clearly marked on the package. The package will be kept by the teacher and returned at the end of the day.

Cell phones are the largest distraction to learning. Therefore, NO CELL PHONES are to be seen on campus. They will be taken away from students if seen and parents will need to pick it up from the office. The second time parents will not get it until end of the trimester; the third time, it stays in the office the remainder of the year.

Communication & Appointments

Most parent communication will be done over email or the schoolwebsite (aisd.edu.bd) orschool official Facebook page. Therefore, it is important we have an accurate, updated email address from both parents as well as phone numbers and mailing address. If you would like to speak with a teacher, office staff or the CEO& Head of School, you can email them directly about setting an appointment and the reason why you want to meet. Email addresses are available in the parents-students handbook. If it is regarding a general comment or feedback, just an email courteously stating your concern or idea would be appreciated. Early Student Withdrawals

Please be advised that school will not provide early Final Examinations to students who are withdrawn from school to travel overseas. We are sensitive to the financial motivation for these early student withdrawals, however, we have found these requests to be disruptive to normal school operations.

Therefore, effective immediately be advised that parents who withdraw students from school early do so at their own risk.

- School will not provide early Final Examinations
- School will not be responsible for providing make-up work for students
- School will grade students as of their status upon withdrawal
- Parents who withdraw students early will sign a Memorandum of Understanding and must maintain their tuition responsibilities.

Photo/Media/Website Release

Students who have achieved success in school should be acknowledged, and public recognition is one means available for that purpose. School may also want to use student photos to use in publications, newsmagazines, and website. Such photo requests often require an immediate response; we ask that if you desire that your childnot participate in such media, to please inform school office. Otherwise, we will assume approval of photos, names, and information for use by Averroes International School in our official pages.

In addition, Schoolwill install video surveillance cameras throughout the campus for security purposes. There are also times when the teacher may record the class for training purposes and professional development.

Birthday Parties

As a general rule, please check with your child's teacher if your family wishes to bring treats for your child's birthday. Treats are acceptable based on teacher's discretion.

Rainy-day Protocol

In case of rain, students will stay indoors in the classrooms, media center, or auditorium during recess and tiffin/lunch.

*Emergency closings will be announced on our school website, official Facebook Page, and through our school email & SMS.

DRESS CODE

The Prophet (SAW) advised us to keep clean, presentable, well groomed and modestly dressed. This is part of our Islamic (etiquettes). Therefore, it is very important that we instill these values in our students from the beginning. While on school campus, students are required to wear the school uniform. Girls 4th through 6th grade must cover their hair with a plain white one-piece scarf. Girls are not allowed to wear make-up or jewelry, except small earrings. Girls are not to have long fingernails or wear faux nails. Boys should be well groomed. Boys need have their shirts tucked in.



School Uniform

All items of clothing and personal items should be labeled with the name, telephone number or classroom of the student. All dress code rules will be enforced while on the campus, during school activities (including field trips), and during school hours. Please support your children as they learn to dress in proper uniform.

STARS OF THE MONTH

Award and Recognition System

The aim of any recognition and award system is to motivate each and every student to do their personal best. Thus it should encourage competition with themselves, not with others. The sense of setting and achieving personal goals helps boost students' confidence and motivation to try even harder.

Each child will have the opportunity every month to earn a "Star" of the month certificate. If they receive at least two or more certificates per trimester, they will earn a reward at the end of the trimester. Certificates will be given out at the end of each trimester by their Class teacher in class. At the end of the year, we will recognize students who have been outstanding throughout the year with a special recognition pin and award.

In order to further promote exceptional behavior from our students, Stars are supported by additional rewards throughout the year such as a free uniform day, ice-cream social, caught being good raffles, etc.

CLASSROOM MEETINGS & POSITIVE DISCIPLINE

Part of the Positive Behavior Support, the classroom meetings help students talk through their problems and find solutions, without resorting to punitive consequences for every school rule infraction. It also helps student internalize doing the right things, even if there is no external reward or consequence.

While AIS will not be implementing a full positive discipline approach as we feel there is still a need for school rules and external consequences, we always look towards adopting best practices that improve student behavior and engagement. Thus a classroom meeting is the best way for students to share their voice and also find the right solutions to behaviors modification, which consequences alone cannot do.

DISCIPLINE REQUIREMENTS

Discipline Philosophy

Discipline is used to encourage positive behavior and self-control. Based on the mission and vision of the school, our goal and perspective of discipline is shaped and informed by the Sunnah of Prophet Muhammad (saw) as he modeled the best example of practicing the decrees of Allah (swt). In the Quran, there are clearly stated expectations of behavior that lead to a positive outcome in this life and the hereafter. There are also very clear expectations and outcomes of behavior that leads to punishment and disapproval by Allah (swt). The Quran sets many ways of reiterating these rules so that no one can claim they did not understand the message. Therefore, it uses both internal and external methods to motivate the believer to proper behavior. Humans are complex and not one method of motivation is appropriate for each person or for each situation. The factors that strongly effect positive behavior in a social setting are:

- Clearly defined rules and consequences
- Being fair and consistent in implementation
- Providing goals for positive behavior and deterrents for negative behavior

Discipline Records

Teachers are asked to write down any disciplinary issues on behavior incident reports for parents to view for their child.

Any student that receives In-School Suspension, Out-of-Suspension or Expulsion will have that entered in their permanent school record that will be forwarded to any school your child attends after AIS. However, detentions and community service requirements will be kept until the end of the year and not be entered into the student's permanent record.

Student Support and Empowerment

Alhamdullilah we are able to provide students with support and encouragement once a week with a qualified Islamic Scholar. Students will be referred by the school administration with consent of parents.

Disciplinary Consequences

The Quranic model of hope and fear is outlined by Allah (SWT) to help human beings to enjoy what is good and to serve as a deterrent to unacceptable behaviors that harm individuals, families and the society at large. Following this model, our school rules are developed to help maintain a safe, respectful and Islamic environment for all our students. Those who consistently break these school rules are creating a non-healthy and negative culture that affects the entire school community. While our goal is always to help each child reach his or her best potential, one person cannot make others change if they do not make the effort to change themselves. Therefore, any functioning community needs to put deterrents in place that is clear, fair, and consistent. And if someone cannot abide by these rules, then there needs to be immediate and just consequences.

Therefore, the following disciplinary measures are intended to use a balanced approach in handling students who are conducting themselves inappropriately. However, each case will be handled on an individual basis by the teacher, principal, and/or the CEO. It is the responsibility of the administrator to review the total situation, consider the offense and the individual support, and take appropriate action to address the behavior.

The School Board has a zero tolerance towards alcohol, drugs, violence, weapons, harassment and bullying. Possession or use of any of these will result in an out of school suspension in addition to a recommendation for expulsion.

The following chart outlines the different school rule violations and their consequences. In most cases, after the third instance of the same offense, a student will receive 1-3 day(s) of out-of-school suspension as well as losing privileges to all enrichment activities for the trimester including fieldtrips, tournaments, camps, and special assemblies.

Additionally, students will be put on disciplinary probation if behavior does not improve. Along the lines of 3 strikes, you're out, if they get three separate out-of-school suspensions, they will be recommended for expulsion.



Disciplinary Probation

A student may be placed on academic or disciplinary probation. Failure to show improvement in the area for which probation was assigned may result in the student being expelled from the school.

Consequence Guidelines

The following guidelines depend on the severity of the offense. These can be changed by the MD & CEOto even stricter consequences if the situation is deemed necessary. If you want to appeal a consequence, you must have do so in writing and send it directly to the MD & CEO who will review it and either respond directly or refer it to the School Board to make a decision. Any of the infractions can lead to automatic expulsion.

TUTORING POLICY ON PRIVATE TUTORING FOR STUDENTS

This policy revolves around the private tutoring of Averroes student(s) by Averroes Teachers as it pertains to teachers' actions/activities and therefore employment status in the School.

A teacher in Averroes International School cannot engage in one of the following actions/activities:

- A teacher in Averroes International cannot do any private tutoring (paid for tutoring) for an Averroes International School student(s).
- A teacher in Averroes International School cannot do any off-premises private tutoring (paid for tutoring) for a Averroes International School student currently (for the current academic year) in their class/subject matter or classroom.

A teacher can privately tutor a student(s) from Averroes International School off premises as long as such student(s) is/are not currently in the teacher's class/subject matter or classroom. However, the School does not promote such off premises activities nor is it responsible in any way for them.

The rationale behind this policy is multi-folded:

- If a teacher is privately tutoring a student that is currently in the teacher's class/subject matter or classroom then that can constitute a conflict-of-interest. Because of this potential conflict-of-interest this action/activity is not allowed.
- If a teacher is privately tutoring a student(s) on School premises that can create the appearance
 of favoritism by the School, represented by its teachers, towards the tutored student(s). Therefore,
 the School cannot allow such action/activity.
- Tutoring on School premises can potentially interfere and even adversely affect School-sponsored tutoring or School-sponsored homework club. For this reason as well, such action/activity cannot be allowed.





Parents' Responsibilities


- Plastic Cover all copies and books and tag them properly


